Reading for the Week

Luke 13.1-9

At that very time there were some present who told him about the Galileans whose blood Pilate had mingled with their sacrifices. He asked them, 'Do you think that because these Galileans suffered in this way they were worse sinners than all other Galileans? No, I tell you; but unless you repent, you will all perish as they did. Or those eighteen who were killed when the tower of Siloam fell on them—do you think that they were worse offenders than all the others living in Jerusalem? No, I tell you; but unless you repent, you will all perish just as they did.'

Then he told this parable: 'A man had a fig tree planted in his vineyard; and he came looking for fruit on it and found none. So he said to the gardener, "See here! For three years I have come looking for fruit on this fig tree, and still I find none. Cut it down! Why should it be wasting the soil?" He replied, "Sir, let it alone for one more year, until I dig round it and put manure on it. If it bears fruit next year, well and good; but if not, you can cut it down."

Message from Rev Eric Lomax

There are huge questions that we face at this time. Two million refugees pouring over the borders of Ukraine, soon to be followed by more. Columns of these poor people walking, driving, riding, all trying to escape the wrath of a dysfunctional Russian army. It is a terrible army, that through poor training and discipline, is incapable of demonstrating any of the qualities of an organised, proportional force. They attack non-combatant civilians, point their missiles at children and pregnant women, they bomb theatres and maternity hospitals, and they do it without shame, remorse or any sense of responsibility. We had forgotten the evil of which human beings are capable, and now we see it again on our doorstep.

I encounter grief, I encounter anger and frustration, almost every day in my work, but the suffering we are witnessing on the other side of our own continent is simply off the scale. We can understand if any of these people fleeing for safety cry out, as Jesus did on the cross, 'My God, my God, why have you forsaken me?' If you are a person of faith in a benevolent, all powerful God, and you encounter this question, you would be wise not to dismiss it with platitudes.

The Theologian, Jurgen Moltmann, in his powerful work 'The Crucified God,' spoke of this question with a real depth of understanding. He, himself, had witnessed suffering in the German armed forces during the Second World War. He wrote about his own sympathy of protest atheism, where people are unable to believe in God because of human suffering. He then said something surprising; 'Without Jesus Christ, I would not believe in God.'

What possible difference could Jesus Christ mean to this question of God and human suffering?

Christians have a unique view of God. Not only do we believe in a God who is a creator, and a God who lives in us by his Spirit, we also believe in something called the Incarnation. This means that in Jesus Christ, God comes to us a human being. As a human being, God went through everything that we go through. He lived like us, he breathed like us and he even suffered like us on the cross. His suffering was so profound that, on the cross, he echoed the words of Psalm 22, by crying out in despair, 'My God, My God, why have you forsaken me?' At that moment of experience, the son of God felt despair and abandonment like so many other human beings, and like many of us are likely to experience at least once in our lives.'

One of the real heroes of this war is the comedian, actor and president of Ukraine, Volodymyr Zelensky. Unlike the author of that terrible war, Zelensky has not hidden inside an opulent palace in Moscow, but has lived alongside his people in Kiev, in constant risk to his life. Putin is undoubtedly powerful with his wealth and his capacity to order death to reign down on the civilian populace of Ukraine. The reality is, however that by living alongside his people at a time of war, and sharing in their experience, he is reputationally far more powerful. God's power is demonstrated not in lightening bolts and earthquakes, but rather in the fact that in Jesus Christ he came to meet us in his son, and stands in solidarity with us in all our human experience. In Jesus Christ, God is with us.



St James's Churchyard Closure

As Parishioners may be aware the Churchyard extension at the rear of the Church has been in use for some time now. In respect of the existing Churchyard, the Parochial Church Council (PCC) has decided that, whilst continuing burials/committal of ashes may be allowed for any member of a family of a person or persons previously buried in the Churchyard, it is logical to seek approval from the Ministry of Justice (MoJ) to declare the formal closure of this Churchyard. This will assist the PCC in that the future maintenance of the Churchyard will be undertaken by the Borough Council. Attached to this article is the formal notice as prescribed by the MoJ. A copy of this notice is being placed in all the local Parish noticeboards. Any Parishioners who still have concerns about this process can contact Laurie Hurn (Churchwarden) for further information in support.

Statutory Notice

PROPOSED CLOSURE OF St James Churchyard, Biddenham, Bedford

Notice is hereby given that it is the intention of the Secretary of State for Justice, acting on an application by the incumbent and churchwardens, to apply to the Privy Council for an Order requiring the discontinuance of burials in the above churchyard.

Provision would be made for the following exceptions:-

a. in any vault or walled grave in the churchyard, burial may be allowed but every coffin in such vault or grave must be separately enclosed by stonework or brick work properly cemented;

b. in any existing earthen grave in the churchyard, the burial may be allowed of the body of any member of the family of the person or persons previously buried in that grave, but no part of the coffin containing the body shall be less than one metre below the level of the surface of the ground adjoining the grave; and

c. in any grave space in which no interment has previously taken place, the burial may be allowed of any person for whom, or any member of the family for which that grave space has been reserved and appropriated, with the exclusive right of burial there, but no part of the coffin containing the body shall be less than one metre below the level of the surface of the ground adjoining the grave.

Any representations about the proposed closure should be sent to the Coroners and Burials Team, Ministry of Justice, 102 Petty France, London SW1H 9AJ (quoting reference CC/MAR/22/032) within 21 days of this publication.
